1. Call to Order and Roll Call of Members

3. Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Devore motioned to approve the February 21, 2024, regular meeting minutes. Motion passed 5-0.

4. New Business

- 4.A Arbor Day Tree Giveaway Program Expansion Proposal
Nichole Baker reviewed the current Arbor Day Tree Giveaway program. The current program will remain in place. New funding has been secured. The new proposal would give away around 30 more trees, and they don't have to be planted in the right of way. This will start next month and addresses L-1.5 of the new sustainability plan regarding green space and tree canopy cover. Commissioner Black motioned to approve the Arbor Day Tree Giveaway Program Expansion Proposal and forward it to City Council for approval. Motion passed 5-0.

5. Unfinished Business

5.A Comprehensive Plan Update

Jeremy Johnston asked members of the Commission if they had any suggestions for the Comprehensive Plan update. Since the new sustainability plan will become part of the update, the members did not have additional information to add. Johnston will come back to the Commission in the future.

5.B Sustainability Energy Plan Strategies

Staff members Behrends Cerniwey and Baker discussed the Sustainability Energy Plan. Grants have been applied for and will likely dictate the priority of actions. The City Council will prioritize policies. Once those are established, the Commission can decide how to take action in a cost-effective manner. Changing the Commission's name was contemplated, but the consensus was to keep the name the same or keep "Environmental" in the title. For the next meeting, the roles and responsibilities of the Commission will be reviewed. Does the Commission want a larger group, including a voting liaison, add a CWU member, etc.?

6. Bicycle Advisory

6.A Bike Month Event Discussion

Nancy Lillquist stated there will be an event at the Farmer's market on May 18, 2024, from 9:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m. with educational materials, helmet fitting, safety checks, possible bike lights, bike bells, tube recycling, and bike exchanges. A couple of bike rides will be scheduled for varying experience levels. For bike month, there are many event days, such as "ride bike to market day", in addition to bike rentals available in Roslyn. Bike safety, bike adventure riders will do presentations, and theft protection will be included during the month. There are possible grants from Cascade bicycle club for two grade school age programs.

6.B Bicycle Friendly Community Report Card

The Commission members will need to prioritize actions. Devore will look into the definition of "bicycle friendly business" in the report card. How to evaluate ridership was discussed. Other areas of the report card that received low numbers will be clarified and looked at to increase the score possibly.

6.C Correspondance from Devorah Greenspan

Public Works had submitted comments in response to the correspondence from Devorah Greenspan. It is agreed that biking on Water Street presents challenges due to all the traffic and reduced space. The bike lane has an uneven lip and chip seal which creates issues. More education involving the public turning and looking for riders before opening the car door is needed. The four-way signs at Dry Creek and Reecer Creek are in the Kittitas County Jurisdiction. Dan Carlson will create a letter of response.
